"The collapse of a modest family farm in a German-speaking community in northern Argentina provides "Germania" with a potent starting point, but tyro director Maximiliano Schonfeld's impressively mounted drama has little follow-through. SINOPSIS

Germania is the story of a Volga-German family's last day in their village in Entre Ríos. The Mother and her two teenage children, Lucas and Brenda, go into an intimate mourning, waiting for goodbye. But the reasons of their leaving the village are mysterious. Their farm has been devastated by a plague, and the villagers -who blame it on divine punishment- try and avoid being too close to them.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Maximiliano Schonfeld was born in 1982, in Crespo, Entre Ríos, Argentina. His debut feature film **GERMANIA**, was awarded at several festivals such as BAFICI, Fresh Film Prague, Hamburg, and Punta del Este. Selected at the Chicago, Gothenburg, Toulouse, among others. Schonfeld was selected to participate at the DOX:LAB, a program, held by the Copenhagen Film Festival, for which he directed the medium-length film **AUSTER**, together with Kadri Kõusaar. He's currently preparing his second feature **THE BLACK FROST**, awarded with the ARTE award at Bafici and selected for the Jerusalem Film Lab.
